FIFA M.A REFEREEING ELITE COURSE AT NJERU

"Match Officials are crucial aspect in our game and as the popularity of football continues to grow all over Uganda, the demand for them seems to be increasing day by day." As FUFA head of referees standing committee was quoted saying It can be a very rewarding challenge, encouraging a healthy life-style as well as significantly contributing to the development of the game in the country.

According to our FUFA Referees Development Plan, which was launched in 2013 by the current FUFA leadership under the stewardship of the federation head Eng. Moses Magogo, set a target of doubling the number of registered referees to 1,000 by 2017?

The FUFA is also a member of the CAF Referee Convention which sets the standards to be met in all areas of refereeing education and administration.

All referees registered with the FUFA are allocated to leagues at all levels around the country. Referees are

licensed at seven different grades and officiate from Under-age games to the Top League of Uganda up to international fixtures.

"There are also a series of workshops held locally and regionally for Grass-root Referees which cover the latest referee techniques and methods." Mr. Mpima Stresses

"All referees must attend an Annual Seminar where they are tested on the Laws of the Game and other aspects necessary to officiate at the relevant level and this is what has just happened recently in FUFA Technical Centre in Njeru."

The League of Uganda Panel also actively participates in a regular series of Workshops and fitness tests held nationally through the year.

Many of today's top referees in Uganda are graduates of the FUFA Referee Education Program which has now taken its course by promoting others like assessors. All Referee education courses are facilitated by licensed FUFA Referee Instructors, CAF and FIFA.

FUFA Referee Observers throughout Uganda are constantly coaching and advising referees as they progress in Refereeing. Both Observers and Tutors also undergo ongoing education and training under the auspices of the FUFA like in this case.

Refereeing in Uganda is overseen by the FUFA Referees Committee. Much of their work at present is focused on the roll-out of education courses across the country for existing referees as well as ensuring that those wishing to become referees have access to beginners' courses and a mentoring programme as well.

According to Mr. Sam Mpiima, the Head of Fufa referees standing committee he emphasizes the course has been brought in to refresh referees on the new updated laws of the game.

"We appreciate FIFA and FUFA for such important courses for our referees to allow them refresh on the updated laws of the game." said Mpiima. *Story continues on Page 2.*

FIFA REFEREES TUTOR CAROLS HENRIQUES ON REFEREEING MISSION AND GOALS

According to him Football is a global sport and its rules must be interpreted and applied with absolute consistency wherever the game is played. As FIFA has a policy of ongoing training for its referees to ensure that refereeing

standards continue to improve and the Laws of the Game are applied the same way everywhere as one of the **Missions** While speaking about the Goals, Mr. Carols was humble enough to summarise different views about FIFA set goals to achieve in refereeing section as clearly pointed out below

- To organize courses and seminars for instructors, referees and assistant referees at international, national and regional level;
- To define fundamental criteria and requirements for instructors of referees and as-

sistant referees;

- To provide up-to-date training programmes and course materials;
- To adopt guidelines on technical support for referees and the appointment of
- Refereeing trios from the same country or confederation for tournaments organised by FIFA;
- To determine the tasks and responsibilities assigned to members of the Referees Committee and to advisers and instructors at tournaments organised by FIFA;

- To revise and update the Laws of the Game and the 'Questions & Answers' booklet under the guidance of the International Football Association Board, in a way that makes innovation possible whilst respecting tradition;

To devise and implement training programmes that prepares both male and female referees for the most important FIFA tournaments.

Carols Henriquez also says he is optimistic Uganda has a bright future when it comes to refereeing and when asked about the reason why Ugandan referees are not officiating in continental premier competitions often. He had this to say.

"See Rome wasn't built in one day so now when refereeing has conquered the credibility again they instead just need a lot of training and support. I am quite confident that in the next CHAN or African Cup of Nations we will have a number of Ugandan representatives."

Happy Henriques who says he likes Ugandan referees because their hardworking he could not hide away his excitement.

"The class has been committed and hardworking and this is what I have liked from Ugandan referees since I started following them."

When asked why our officials can't use refereeing modern gadgets mostly here in Uganda's football, he hurriedly answered that basing on the financial muscle of fellow Member Associations.

"Look even CAF haven't acquired all these gadgets. Goal-line technology is so expensive to afford. But CAF knows when they can afford it as well as FUFA too."

UGANDA CUP 2014/15: Kyambogo's magical run continues, faces 7 Top flight Teams

The beauty of all knock out cup competitions world over lies upon the tagged 'minnows' eliminating the 'heavy-weights' to cause upsets.

Tales of non-league teams ejecting elite sides have been repeatedly scripted time immemorial since the Cup's inception in 1971.

Precisely, the 2014/15 edition of the Uganda Cup has lived to its billing that has witnessed mouth watering clashes, breathe taking skills, goals, thrills and obviously, the anticipated surprises have all lived to pass.

The time line of this event stretches as far back as the last 44 years.

Worth noting, confirming the Uganda Cup as the oldest knock out competition in Uganda.

From the preliminary round action, already the cup has witnessed some of the giants survive with a narrow escape and others 'massacred and buried'.

Eight time winners, Sports Club Villa survived the jaws of elimination at the round of 64 after Buganda regional side, Azam F.C forced a penalty shoot out that the Bweyogerere based outfit eventually lost.

Express F.C, the record holders (10 titles under their belt) were shocked 2-1 at the round of 64 by Kitara based Airtel F.C in Hoima.

The same team (Airtel F.C) held Police F.C to a non scoring draw after normal time before bowing out to the Cops' team 0-3 in FIFA Post match penalties.

Kampala regional side, Kyambogo Football club has been the biggest revelation of the season thus far, eliminating Azam Uganda Premier League table leaders, Vipers at the round of 64,



Rwenzori Big league favorites, The Saints F.C (Round of 32) and elite side, Sadolin Paints F.C (round of 16). Kyambogo F.C team manager, Charles Ssemenda is well aware of the burden of expectations bestowed upon his team.

"I respect all the teams remaining in the cup but, we are unfazed by the mere names. We shall give in our best, all the way" Ssemenda re-affirms to **FUFA MONTHLY**. Kyambogo F.C will dwell on

inspirational pillars that include goal keeper Joseph Etyang, midfield icon Ramsey Kintu and striker, Brian Kayemba.

Biggest Score So Far:

Rwenzori based FUFA Big league side, The Saints F.C hold the record of this year's biggest score line 1-12 away in Masindi against regional side, Steel F.C. In the other impressive score line recorded, Umar Kasumba and Umar Bulega

each scored a hat trick to combine 6 goals for Police F.C against Big league side, Baza Holdings at Kawanda in the round of 16 engagement.

2014/15 Favorites:

SC Villa and KCC have both won the cup 8 times and will be aiming for the unprecedented 9th title. Another previous winner, Sports Club Victoria University (winners in 2013/14 edition) cannot be left out of the box given the fact that they boast

of the second top scorer, Fahad Tokko (5 goals), one behind top scorer, Fred Kyambadde (of The Saints F.C).

Uganda Revenue Authority (URA), winners of the 2013/14 edition have been since eliminated by Kampala City Council at the round of 16.

The winner of the Uganda Cup represents the country at the CAF Confederations Cup.

Teams in the Quarter Finals:

Kyambogo University, KCC, SC Villa, Lweza, SC Victoria University, Bright Stars, Police and Jinja side, BUL F.C remain the last 8 teams still in contention.

Quarter Final Dates:

The quarter finals shall be held between 12th -19th April 2015. In case of a draw, the teams will play the extra-time and if the result still persists, then FIFA post match penalties will decide the fixture outcome. Can Kyambogo Football Club claim their first? Only time will tell.

LET'S LEARN

1-Did you know that; an International Transfer Certificate (ITC) is not required for a player under the age of 12 years.

2- Did you know that; A Club which loses its registered player due to certified permanent physical or mental incapacitation, death, imprisonment for a minimum of three (3) months or when a player goes abroad for further studies or employment for a period exceeding three (3) months shall be free to register another player during either of the two (2) registration periods. The incapacity shall have to be certified by the FUFA Medical Committee. Such a case shall be treated as just cause for contracted players.
